

MOBILITY PROVISIONS FOR SPONSORED WORKERS

CHANGES TO CONDITION 8107 (SUBCLASS 482 VISA)

As of July 2024, visa holders now have extended time to find a new employer without breaching their visa conditions:

- Up to **180** consecutive days, and
- Up to **365** days in total without working, while still holding a Subclass 482 (SID) visa



You may now have more time to find a new sponsor without breaching your visa conditions. Check your visa conditions and see if these changes apply to you.

WHAT CAN YOU DO DURING TRANSITION?

While a Subclass 482 visa holder is between sponsors (for up to 180 consecutive days or 365 total days), they will not breach their visa if they:

- Stop working altogether
- Work for themselves
- Work for a non-sponsoring employer

WHAT YOU CAN DO DURING THIS TIME

While between sponsors, you can:



Stop working altogether



Work for yourself



Work for a non-sponsoring employer



IF YOU'VE BEEN EXPLOITED AT WORK, YOU MAY BE ABLE TO STAY IN AUSTRALIA TO TAKE LEGAL ACTION

You'll need certification from a participating government agency or accredited thirdparty confirming:
